
The specimens used in constructing Australopithecus Anamensis were found at Allia Bay, but were spread over a distance of 1Km. (*Nature*, Vol. 376, 1995 p:565)



The dates for Australopithecus Anamensis were calculated using correlations. This means that the palaeontologists constructed a 'complete' geological column based on the probability that the layers on rock at different sites could be meshed accurately together. This included samples at great distance from the sites.
